Akparata Health Center Opened 1 April 2015

Akparata Health Centre opened 1st April 2015 in Effium, Ohaukwu LGA. The building was constructed by the community with assistance from AMURT. Government assisted with some health workers. The response has been overwhelming with over 960 patients, 269 ante-natal bookings and 54 deliveries in three months. Preparations are underway to open another clinic in Inikiri, Effium.

At the half year mark, we have already reached 87 % of 2014's total for deliveries. Free delivery is available to mothers from within the project area that attend ante-natal and Pregnant Women Support Group meetings. Staff are on duty 24 hours a day, every day. Doctor, ultrasound screening and labservices are available on antenatal days. Mothers from villages that qualify receive ante-natal refund.

Capacity building for community Jan-Jun 2015

In first half of 2015 conducted three day training programs for six Clinic Management Committees followed up by regular monitoring. The clinics are run by govt. health workers together with additional staff, volunteers and trainees recruited from the community. AMURT staff provide daily training and supervision to build the capacity in the communities















Maternal Health Outreach Jan-Jun 2015

The maternal health outreach programs include village maternal health promoters elected by the women in each village, monthly Pregnant Women Support Group Meetings, Health education and home visits for women and babies identified as high risk by specially trained health workers. 15 new Maternal Health Promoters were elected during the period for a total of 118. 1195 pregnant women have participated in support group meetings this year. 122 pregnant women identified during antenatal day as high risk were monitored and visited, 82 of them have given birth so far this year.













Water & Sanitation Jan-Jun 2015



AMURT drilled five boreholes and trained WASHCOMs in Effium, Ohaukwu. Two villages in Ibenda, two in Akparata and one Inkiri now have easy access to good water. (AMURT also drilled two boreholes in Abia State). Monitoring visits made to over 60 WASHCOMs trained by AMURT. Concentration was on ending open defecation by diging pit latrines and promotion of hand washing through Tippy Taps. AMURT intervened in a cholera outbreak Elugwu Ettam.
